

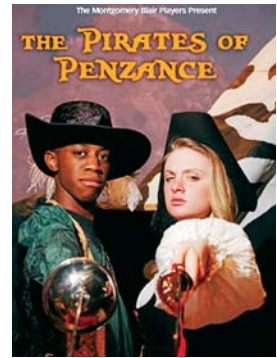
# Today's Blair
