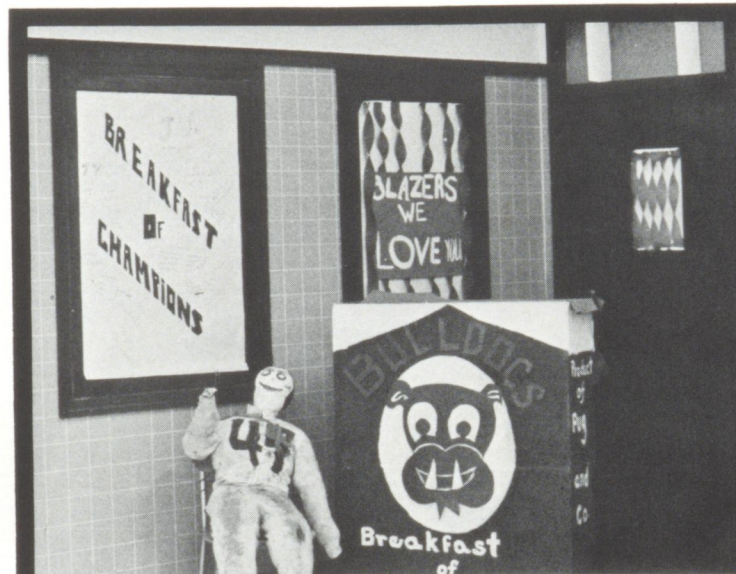

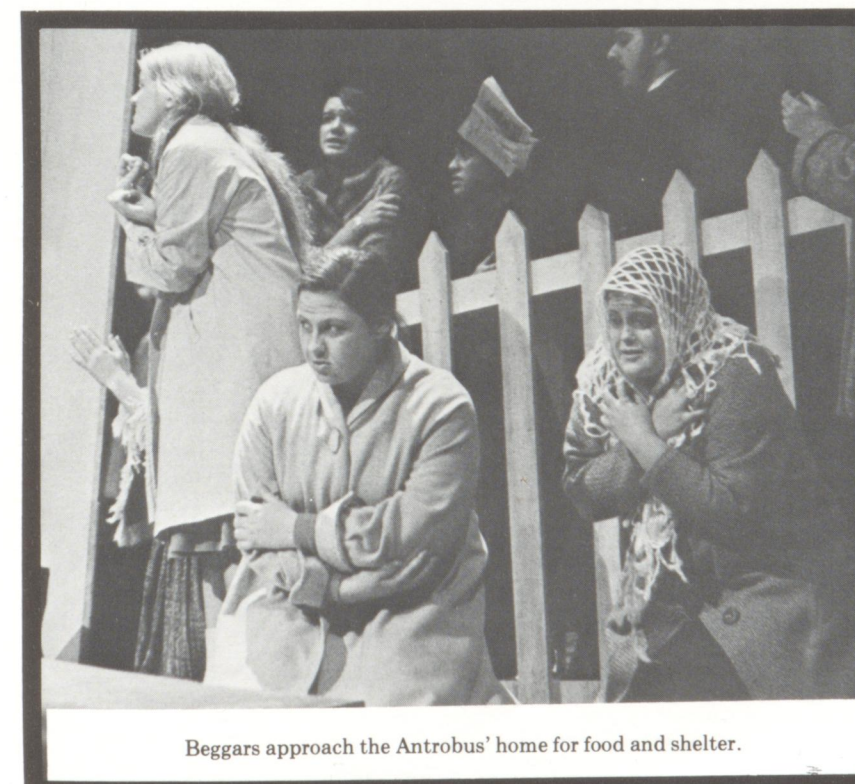

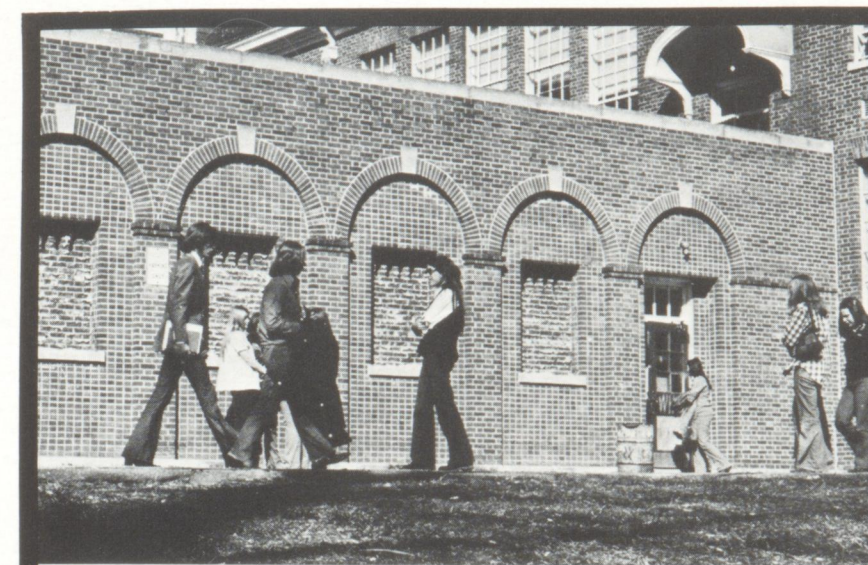

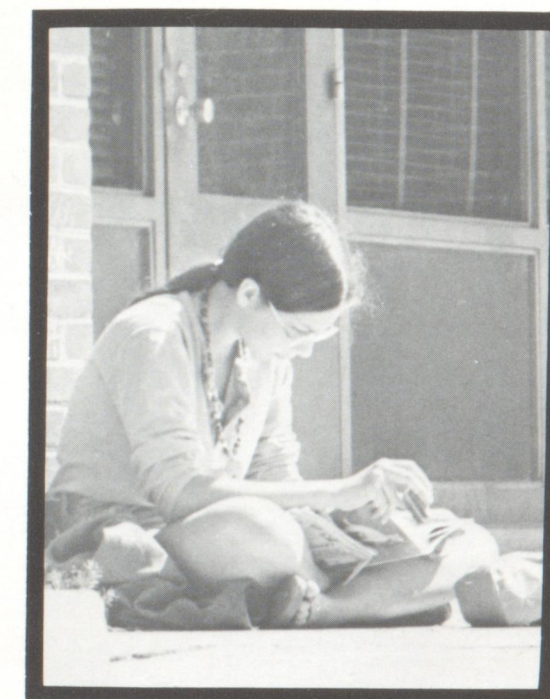
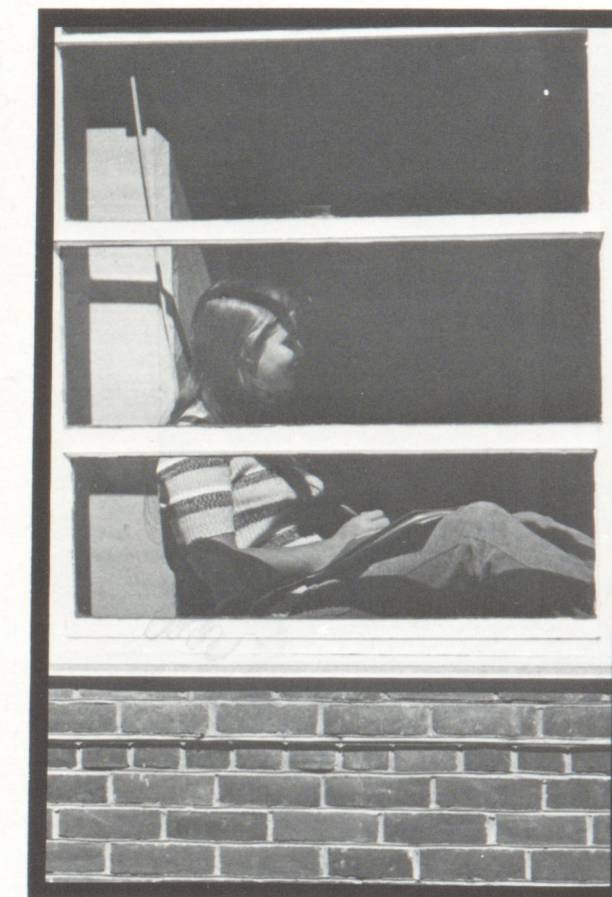
Rising thermometers mark a mild winter

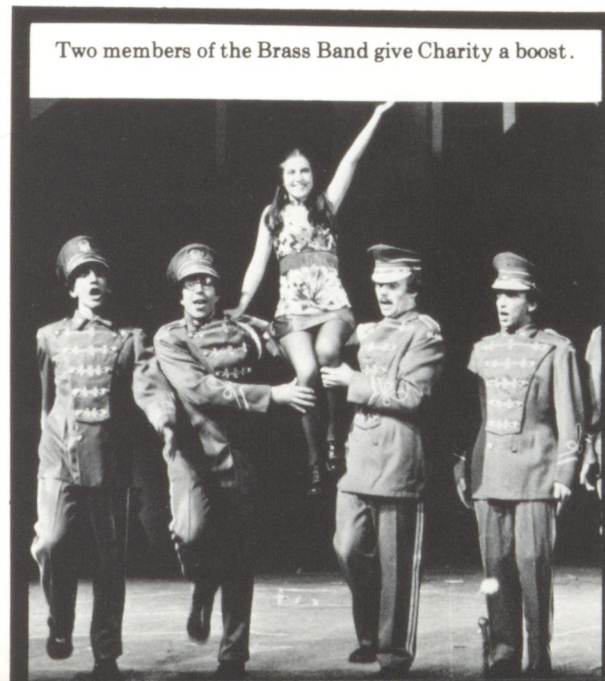

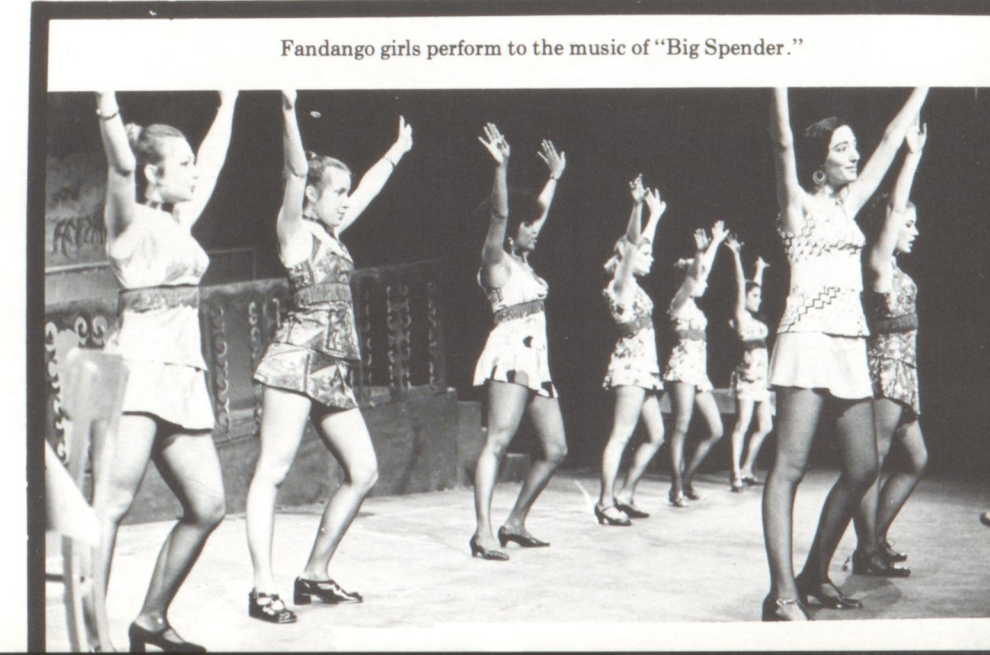

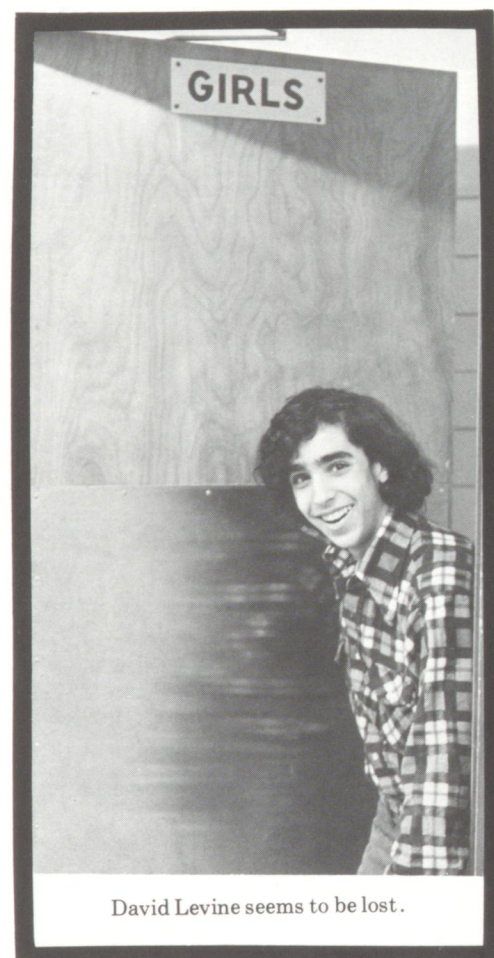

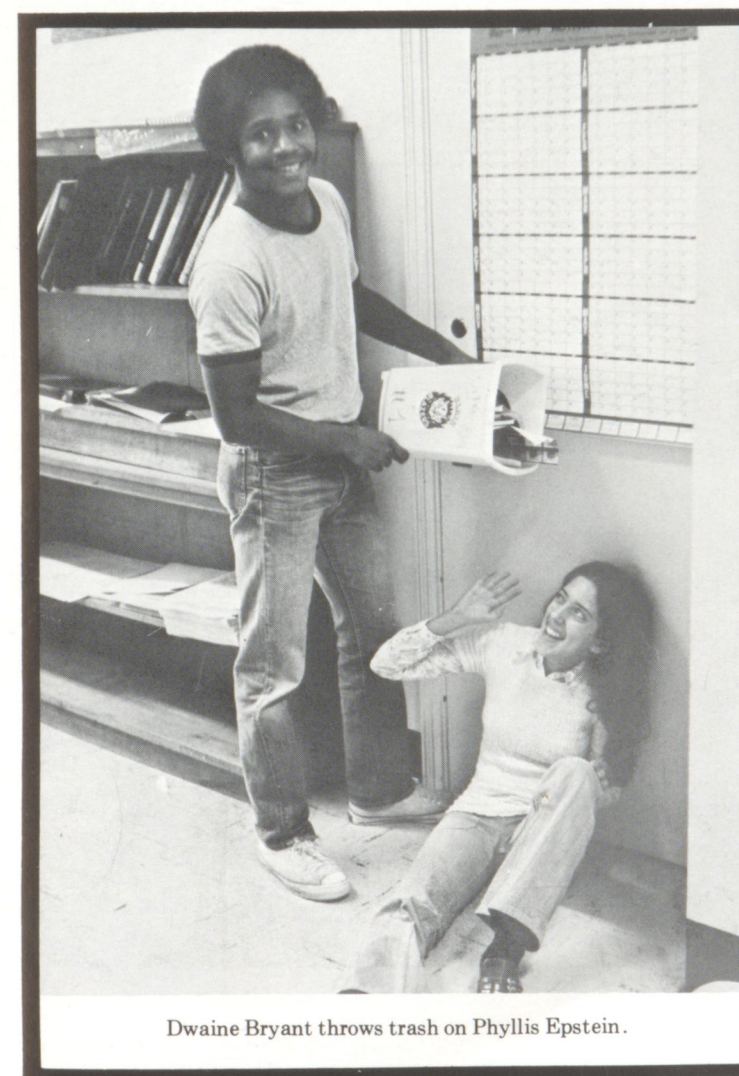

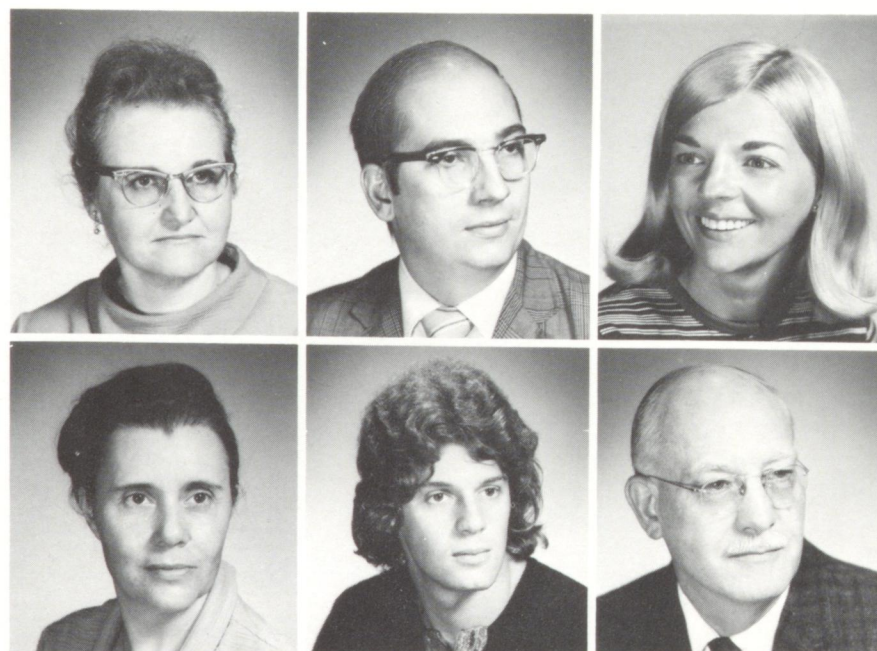

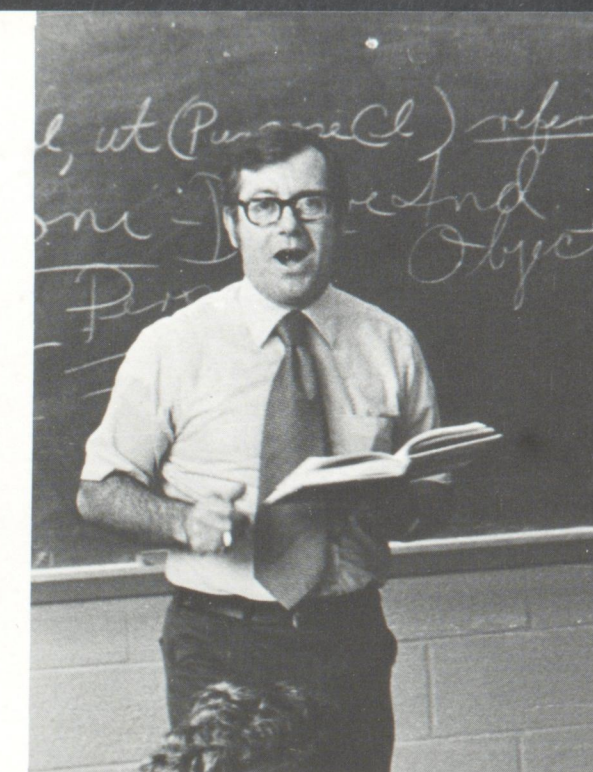

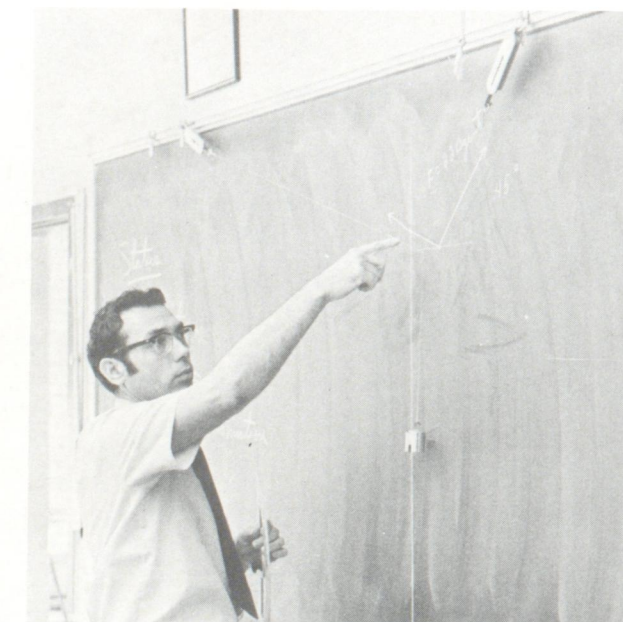

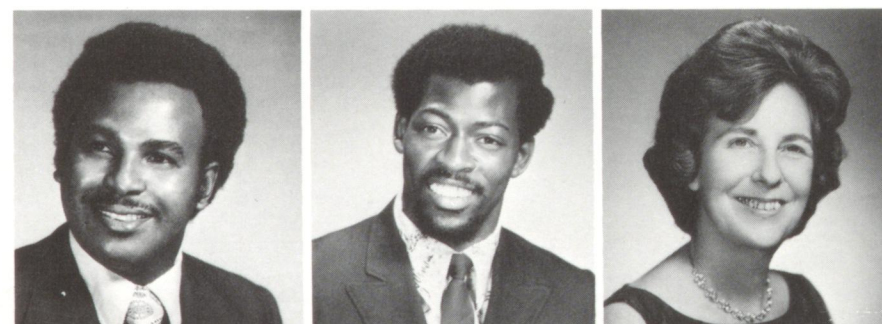

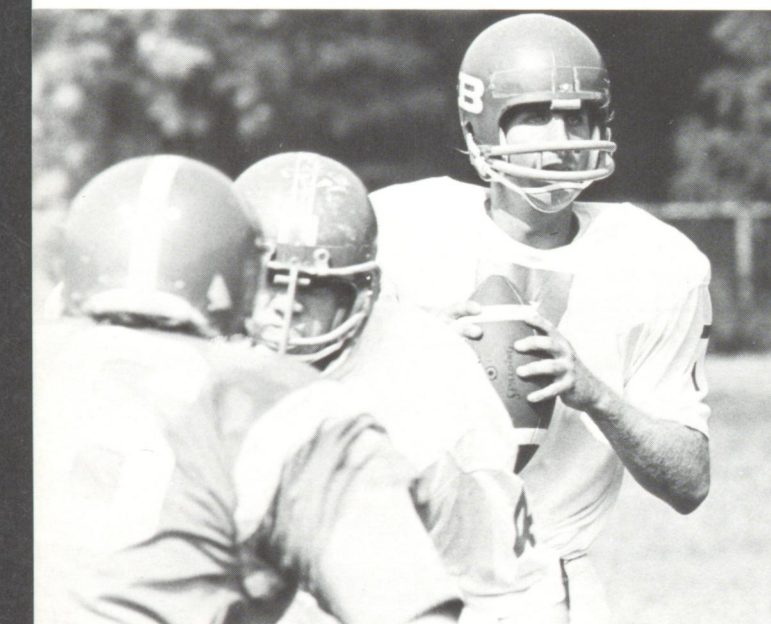

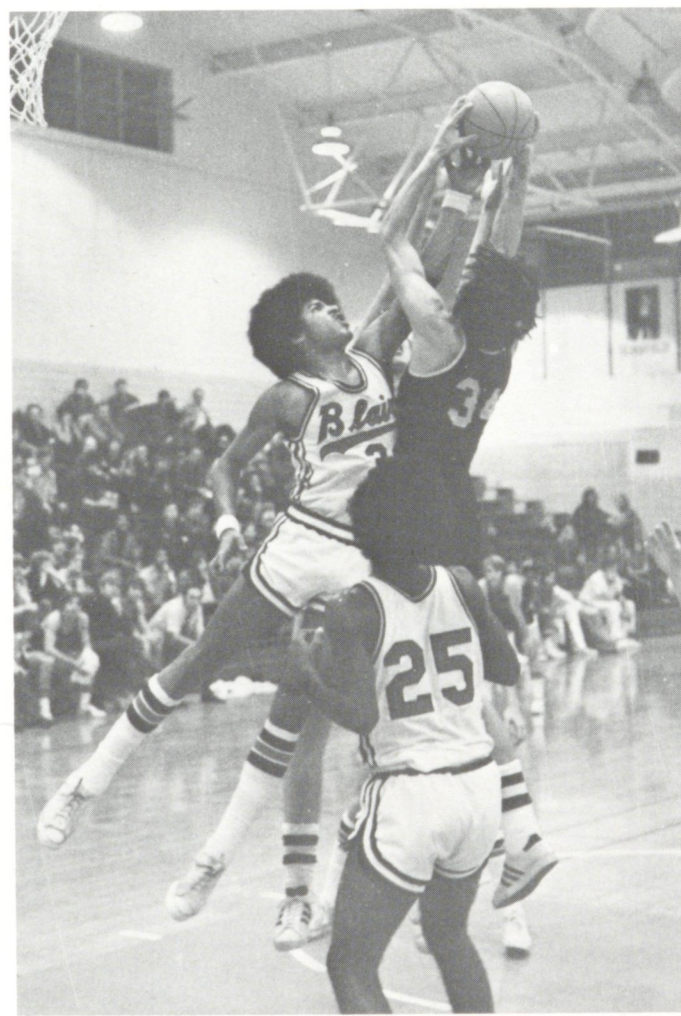

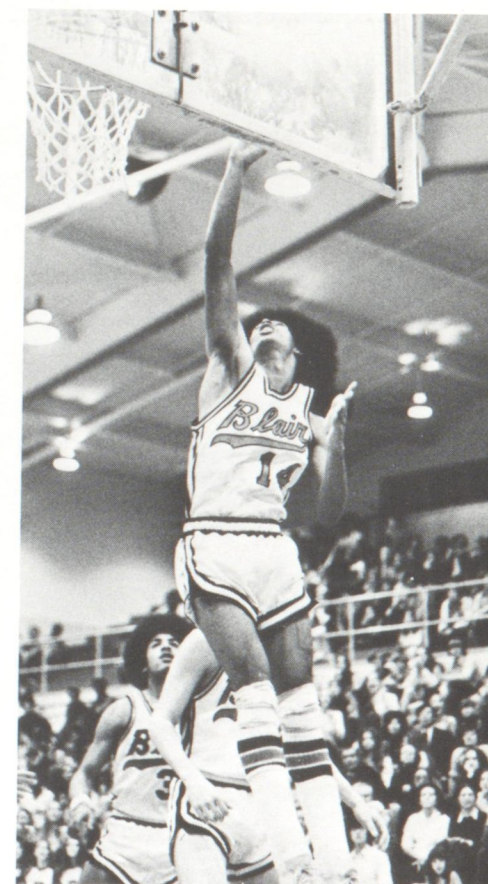

Wrestlers grapple with tough competition

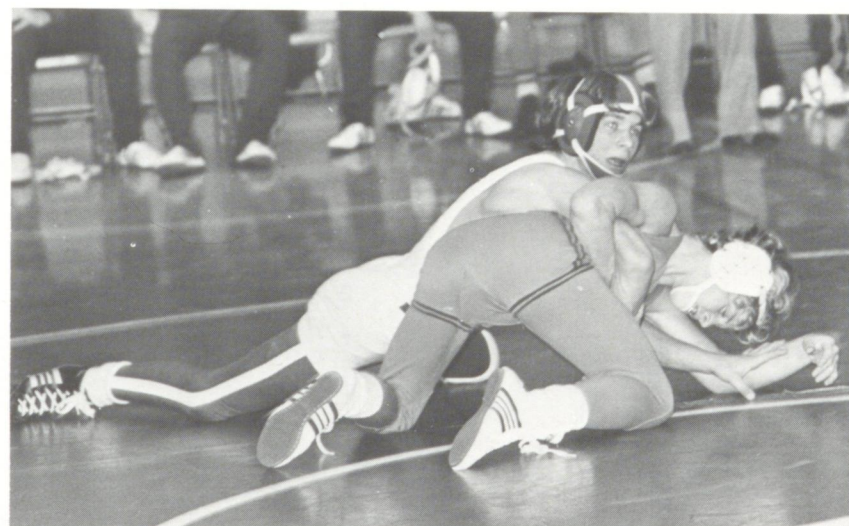

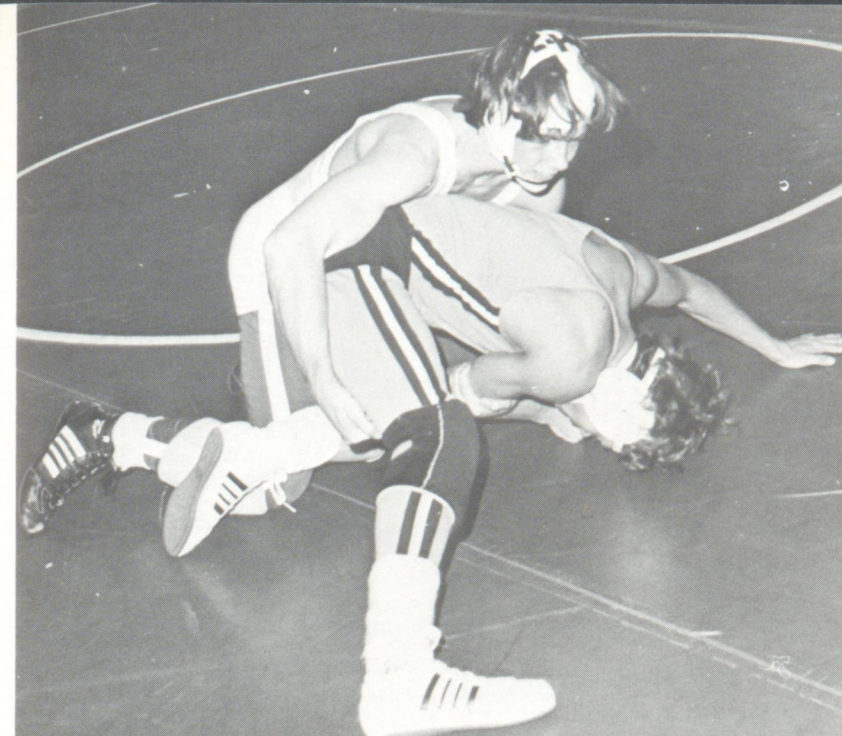

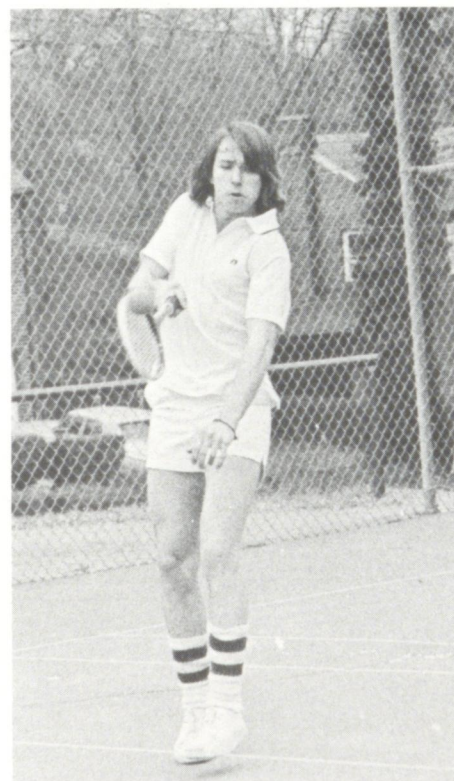

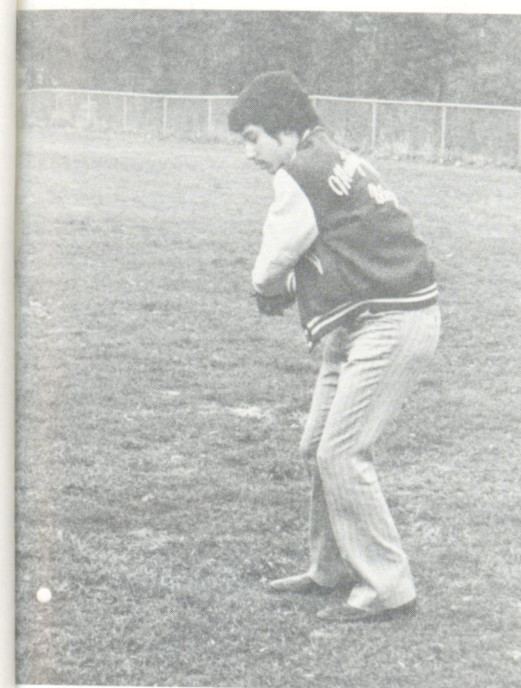

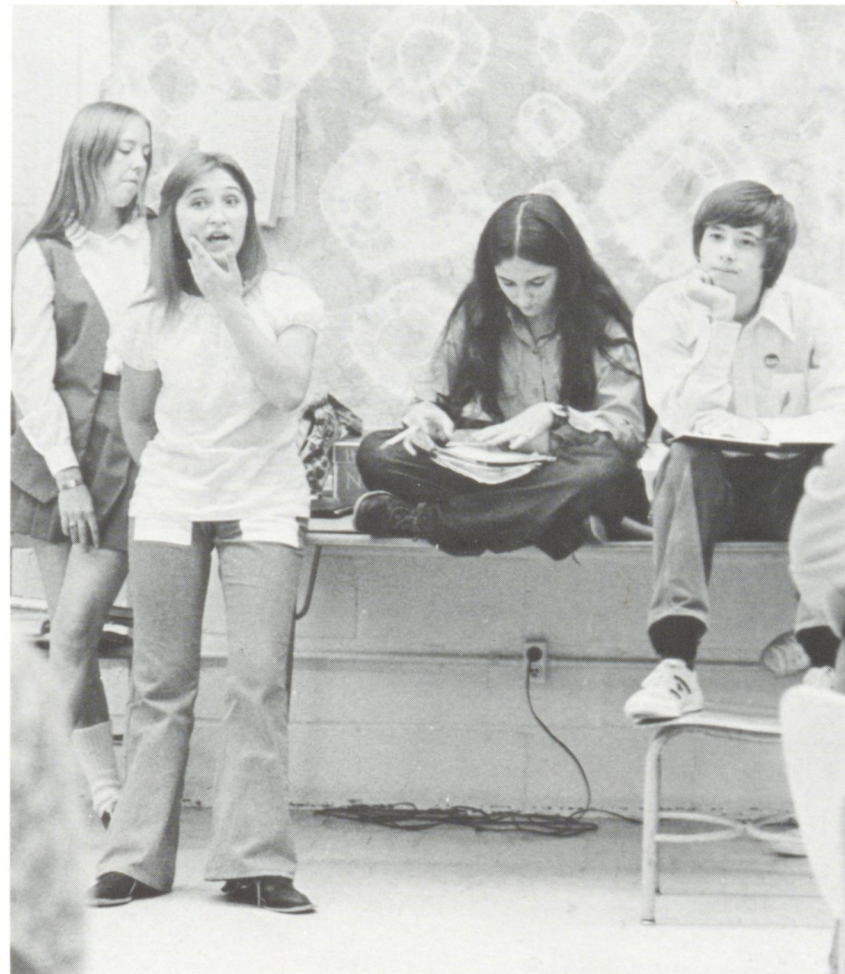

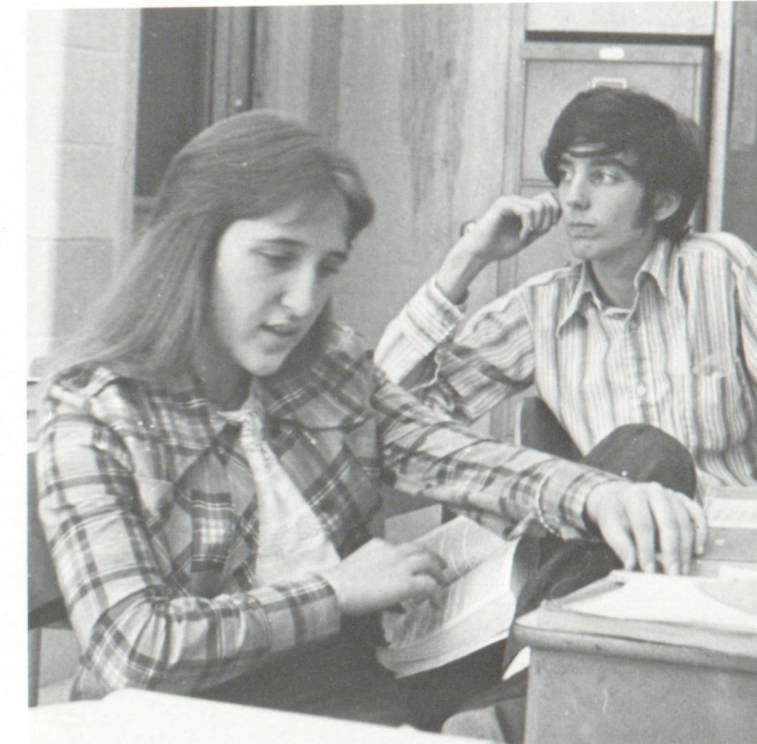

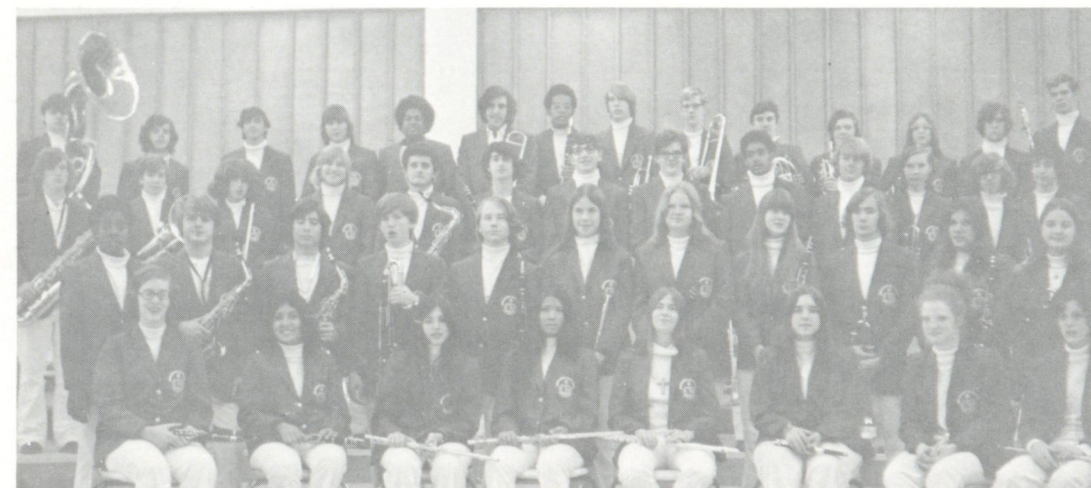

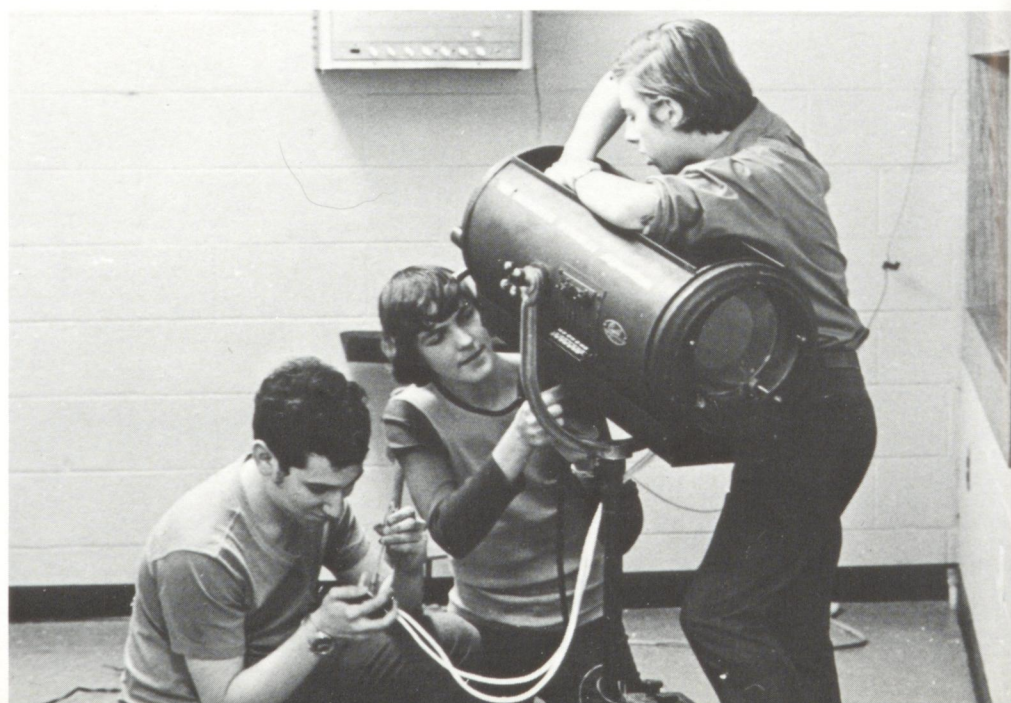

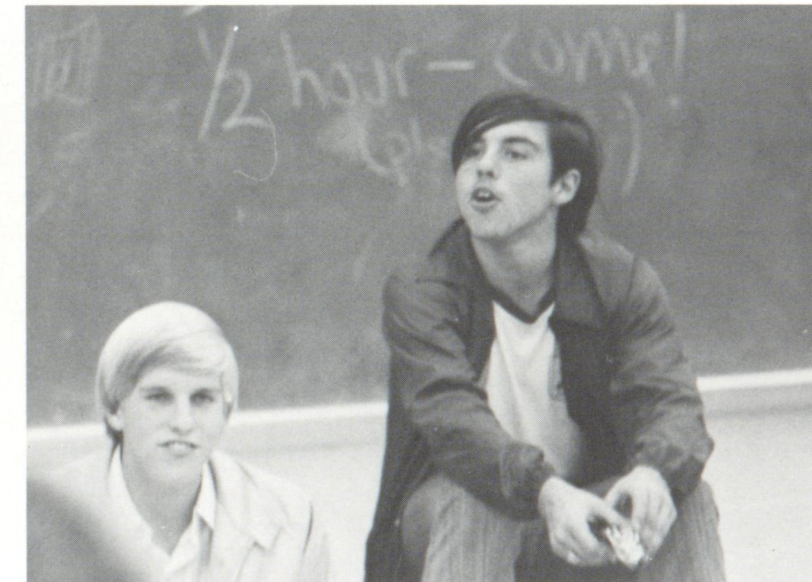

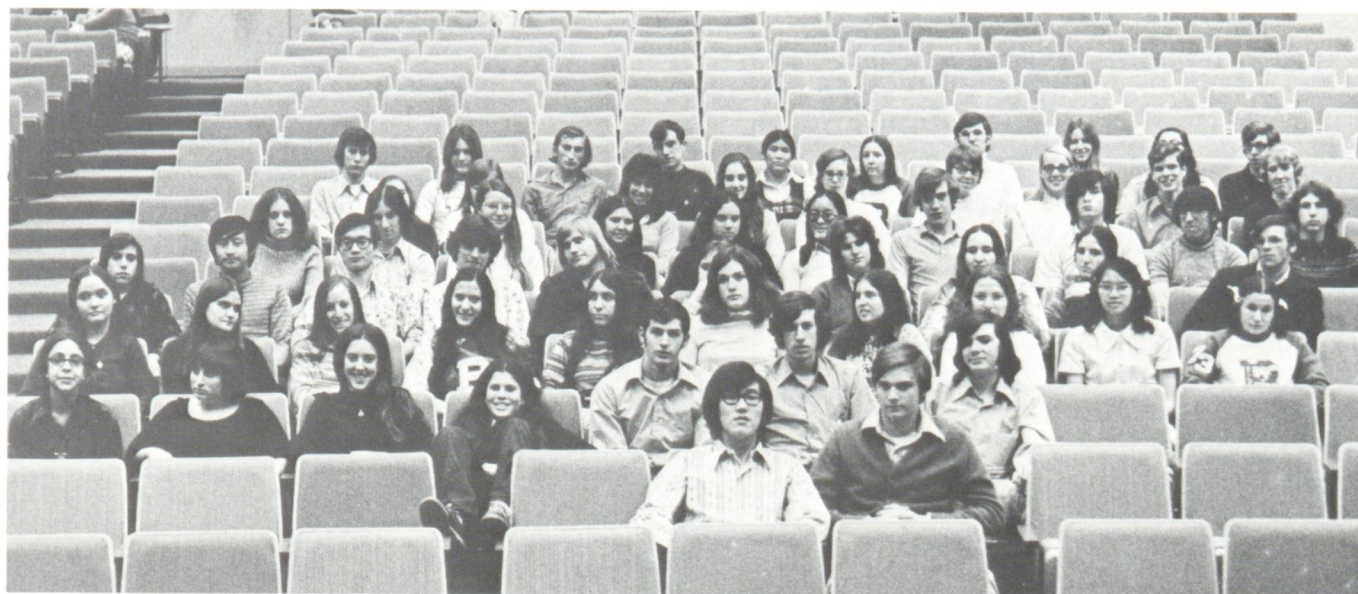

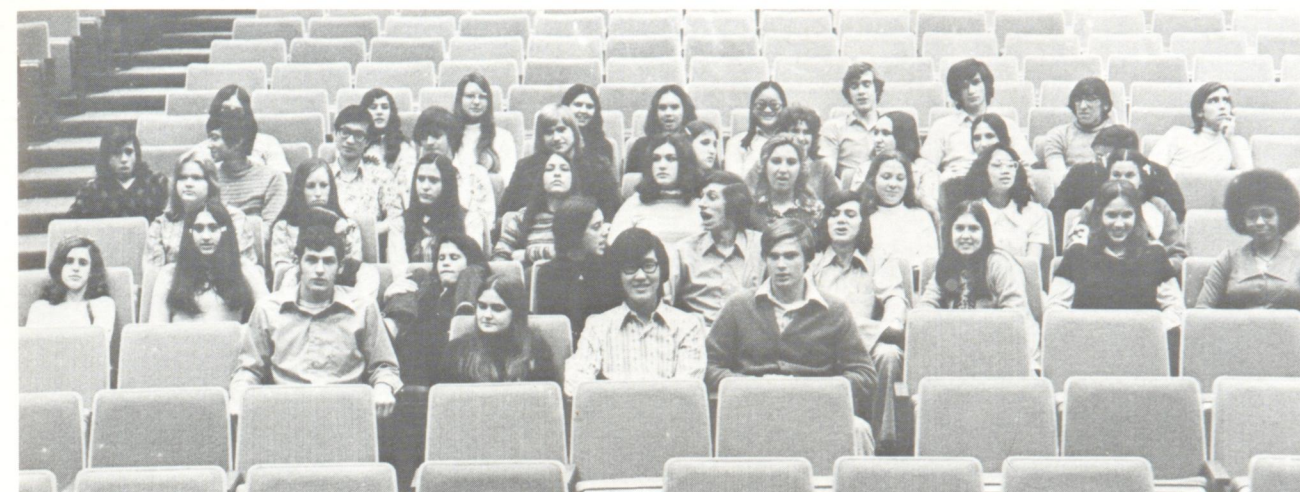
